Document Check-in is <u>required</u> for all new F-1 and J-1 international students. Please bring the following documents to the ISO check in:

- · Your passport and visa
- Your I-20 (F-1) or DS-2019 (J-1)
- Your I-94 record (Go to https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/I94/ and click "Get Most Recent I-94")




BE PREPARED FOR WINTER WEATHER UPDATES

UPCOMING EVENT



Every year, the Myatt Center for Diversity and Inclusion hosts a lecture in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. In honor of Dr. King, we will be hosting Dr. Kamille Gentles-Peart, Associate Professor of Communications and Media at Roger Williams University on Thursday, January 30, 2020. The event will begin at 4:30 pm in the Myatt Center. The title of the lecture is: "Decolonizing Thick Black Female Bodies."

Many Black women in the African diaspora report a preference and desire for a "thick" body - curvy bodies with hips, and round, prominent buttocks.

However, thick Black female bodies are

simultaneously perceived and treated as monstrous, deviant, and unfeminine in white supremacist discourses. Answering Black feminists' call to decolonize Black women's bodies from race-gender oppressions, this talk considers how everyday Black women in the U.S. participate in emancipating "thick" Black female bodies from colonialist and racist ideologies.

REMEMBERING MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.



Martin Luther King Day is celebrated on Monday, January 20, 2020. It is a federal holiday in the U.S. that celebrates the life and achievements of Martin Luther King Jr., an influential American civil rights leader. He is most well-known for his campaigns to end racial segregation on public transport and for racial equality in the United States. The University of New Haven will be closed on Monday in observance of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.
