TIME TO CHECK YOUR I-20 OR DS-2019 END DATE

If you have an F-1 or J-1 student visa, it's very important to check the end date on your I-20 or DS-2019. **If your I-20 or DS-2019 is ending in December 2019 and you plan to continue your studies in the spring or beyond, you must extend your document before the current end date.**

An extension of your I-20 or DS-2019 must be completed in advance of the program end date. Please note that we will not be able to extend your I-20 or DS-2019 after the end date has passed. If you do not extend your program before the end date, you will be considered out of status and could be subject to deportation, so it's very important to check and to complete the necessary steps early! If you need to apply for an I-20/DS-2019 Program Extension, you can find the form on **mu CHARGER**

Once You're Born You Can No Longer Hide The Italian

(Quando sei nato non puoi piu' nasconderti) Italian

One night, during a sailing trip through the Medi-

terranean, Sandro, the only son of a wealthy Italian entrepreneur, falls overboard. Although given up for dead, Sandro, instead, has been rescued by a fishing boat carrying illegal immigrants to Italian shores. Two different trips are the beginning of an adventuresome return to Italy, at the end of which nothing will ever be the same. Directed by Marco Tullio Giordana and released in 2015.

Lion of the Desert

(أسد الصحراء) Arabic Time: 6:00pm

This desert epic is about a Libyan hero who helped his nation fend off an Italian invasion in 1929. Anthony Quinn stars as Omar Mukhtar, who organizes Libyan forces to hold off the encroaching Italian troops under General Rodolfo Graziana, who are trying to gain a foothold on Libyan soil under direct orders from the Italian dictator Mussolini. With the persistence of Mukhtar, the Libyans, battling the tanks and guns of the Italian army with their Bedouin troops on horseback, managed to hold off the Italians for twenty years, until Mukhtar was finally captured and executed. Directed by Moustapha Akkad and released in 1981.

Six year old Vanya is an orphan near St. Petersburg, Russia, who is determined to find his mother, despite the fact that an Italian couple has arrived at his run down rural orphanage to take him to a new home in Italy. To leave his country would mean to sever ties with his mother, so, with the help of friends, Vanya embarks on an adventurous but dangerous journey to get closer to what is more important to him than anything else in life. This unsentimental film takes us into the dark world of abandoned children and lets us see their joy and pain from their own unique perspective. Directed by Andrei Kravchuk and released in 2005.


The Gua Sha Treatment (創物)

Grandfather Xu comes from China to visit the family of his son, Datong Xu, in St. Louis. While there, he gives his grandson, Dennis Xu, a treatment of Gua Sha to treat a slight fever. Social workers mistake the harmless traditional Chinese medical treatment for child abuse due to the marks left on Dennis' back. The life of the family is sent into turmoil when Dennis is taken away by the child protection agency. After a long and torturing process, the family is reunited. Directed by Xiaolong Zheng and released in 2001.

If you live on campus, be advised that residence halls close for Thanksgiving Break on Wednesday, Nov. 27 at 10 a.m. for all students.

If you are planning to stay on campus for Thanksgiving Break, you must submit a Thanksgiving Break Housing Request on myHousing before Wednesday, Nov. 20. This includes graduate students living in Savin Court or the Atwood apartments.

Keep in mind that on campus food services and shuttles may have adjusted schedules during Thanksgiving break. Once schedules are confirmed, we will include them in a future newsletter.



- The Thanksgiving meal centers around a roasted turkey. Other "classic" elements of the meal are mashed potatoes, stuffing, cranberry sauce, roasted vegetables, and pies for dessert.
- The average number of calories consumed on Thanksgiving is 4,500.
- Approximately 46 million turkeys are eaten each year on Thanksgiving.
- Thanksgiving is the busiest travel day of the whole year in the U.S. (even busier than Christmas).
- Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade is the second largest consumer of helium in the country. In 2010, the parade had 15 balloons and used 300,000 cubic feet of helium to keep them floating!
- The tradition of football on Thanksgiving began in 1876 with a game between Yale and Princeton. The first NFL games were played on Thanksgiving in 1920.
