FEELING STUCK ON A PAPER?

Did you know that the University of New Haven has a **University Writing Center** to support undergraduate and graduate students with the writing process as they write for a wide variety of purposes, disciplines, or audiences?

Make an appointment on myCharger and bring your assignment, your ideas, and any writing you've done so far. Peer tutors are trained to give you the tips and direction to help you succeed. Tutors will not write or edit your paper for you, but they will gladly help you identify errors in grammar and punctuation. The goal is to help writers develop confidence and hone their skills so they become more comfortable with their individual writing process and style.

There are a variety of scams that target University students and international students. It is important to protect yourself and be aware of resources to help you avoid common scams and keep your personal information safe.

Be aware that occasionally scammers try to impersonate government officials to intimidate students into giving them personal information or money. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), which includes U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), will never ask you to transfer money to an individual. In addition, you will never be asked to pay fees via phone or by email.

If you receive a threatening call or message from someone claiming to be a government or law enforcement official, you should:

- Not give the person any personal or financial information.
- Collect the caller's contact information.
- End the conversation immediately if threats and intimidation persist.
- Contact the ISO at iso@newhaven.edu to report the incident.
