What is your thesis about?

I am testing three separate HPV negative cervical cancers to see if they have the Folate Receptor. Folic Acid is Vitamin B-9, and helps keep our cells healthy and helps them divide. I want to see whether Folic

Acid is getting into these cancer cells, which is why I'm looking for the folate receptor. This might help us decide whether folic acid can be used as a treatment for cervical cancer, or if the receptor could be a target for cervical cancer!
