# What is your thesis about?

Red flag laws, also known as Extreme Risk Protective Orders, were designed to allow law enforcement to temporarily confiscate the firearms of a person reported to be a danger to themselves or others. However, how effective, if at all, are these laws in preventing mass shootings? This
